# TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY 2007

# FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY 2007

#### AFRICA

# Chad / Central African Republic / The Sudan

S/PRST/2007/2 of 16 January 2007

Requests the Secretary-General to submit, <u>by the middle of February 2007</u>, updated and finalized recommendations on the size, structure and mandate of a United Nations multidimensional presence in eastern Chad and north-eastern Central African Republic.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by mid-February 2007.

#### Cross-border issues in West Africa

S/PRST/2006/38 of 9 August 2006

Last para.: requests the Secretary-General, in consultations with the ECOWAS secretariat, to submit to the Security Council by the end of the year a report with recommendations on the cooperation between the United Nations missions deployed in the region and on the cross-border issues in West Africa.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued <u>during end February / early March</u> 2007.

# Democratic Republic of the Congo – MONUC

Resolution 1711 (2006) of 29 September 2006

Para. 10: requests the Secretary-General to submit recommendations to the Security Council on an adjustment, after the completion of the electoral process, to the mandate and capacities of the United Nations Organization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUC) by the end of January 2007.

An update will be provided by the Secretariat.

Para. 1: decides to extend the mandate of MONUC until 15 February 2007.

The MONUC mandate will expire on 15 February 2007.

# Resolution 1711 (2006) of 29 September 2006

Para. 2: decides to extend <u>until 15 February 2007</u> the increase in the military and civilian police strength of MONUC authorized by resolutions 1621 (2005) and 1635 (2005).

# Resolution 1736 (2006) of 22 December 2006

Para. 1: authorizes, from 1 January 2007 until the expiry of MONUC's mandate on 15 February 2007, an increase in the military strength of MONUC of up to 916 military personnel, to allow for the continued deployment to MONUC of the infantry battalion and the military hospital authorized under the ONUB mandate, and expresses its intention to examine this issue further before 15 February, in the context of the Secretary-General's forthcoming proposals, with a view to ensuring that MONUC has adequate capabilities to perform its mandate.

The authorizations to increase MONUC's strength will expire on 15 February 2007.

### Democratic Republic of the Congo - sanctions

# Resolution 1698 (2006) of 31 July 2006

Para. 8: requests the Secretary-General to present <u>before 15 February 2007</u>, in close consultation with the Group of Experts, a report comprising an assessment of the potential economic, humanitarian and social impact on the DRC population of the implementation of the possible measures referred to in paragraph 6 of the resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 15 February 2007.

#### Somalia

# S/PRST/2001/30 of 31 October 2001

Requests the Secretary-General to submit reports, at least <u>every four months</u>, on the situation in Somalia and efforts to promote the peace process.

## Resolution 1725 (2006) of 6 December 2006

Para. 7: requests the Secretary-General, in consultation with the Commission of the African Union and the secretariat of the Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD), to report to the Security Council on the implementation of the mandate of a Peacekeeping Mission of IGAD in Somalia (IGASOM) within 30 days, and every sixty days thereafter.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 28 February 2007.

# The Sudan - UNMIS

# Resolution 1714 (2006) of 6 October 2006

Para. 2: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council <u>every three months</u> on the implementation of the mandate of the United Nations Mission in the Sudan (UNMIS).

The report of the Secretary-General dated 29 January 2007 (S/2007/42) is before the Security Council.

# The Sudan - Darfur

Resolution 1590 (2005) of 24 March 2005

Para.12: requests that the Secretary-General continue to report on a monthly basis on the situation in Darfur.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued during February 2007.

#### **AMERICAS**

## Haiti - MINUSTAH

Resolution 1702 (2006) of 15 August 2006

Para. 1: decides to extend the mandate of the United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti (MINUSTAH) until 15 February 2007, with the intention to renew for further periods.

The MINUSTAH mandate will expire on 15 February 2007.

Para. 20: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the implementation of MINUSTAH's mandate <u>not later than 31 December 2006</u>.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 19 December 2006 (S/2006/1003) is before the Security Council.

# **ASIA**

# The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question

Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para. 7: invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

#### Timor-Leste - UNMIT

Resolution 1704 (2006) of 25 August 2006

Para. 12: requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council closely and regularly informed of developments on the ground, including in particular the state of preparations for the 2007 elections and of the implementation of the mandate of the United Nations Integrated Mission in Timor-Leste (UNMIT), and to submit a report no later than 1 February 2007, with recommendations for any modifications such progress might allow to size, composition, mandate and duration of the UNMIT presence.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be before the Security Council <u>during</u> February 2007.

Para. 1: decides to establish UNMIT for an initial period of six months, with the intention to renew for further periods.

The UNMIT mandate will expire on 25 February 2007.

A meeting between the Security Council and the troop-contributing countries will take place prior to the expiration of the UNMIT mandate.

#### **EUROPE**

Resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999) – future status

S/PRST/2005/51 of 24 October 2005

Requests that the Secretary-General provide <u>regular updates</u> on progress in determining Kosovo's Future Status, as defined by resolution 1244 (1999).

#### **OTHER**

#### Non-proliferation – Iran

Resolution 1737 (2006) of 23 December 2006

Para. 19: decides that all States shall report to the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1737 (2006) within 60 days of the adoption of the resolution on the steps they have taken with a view to implementing effectively paragraphs 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 12 and 17 of the resolution.

All States are expected to report to the 1737 Committee by 23 February 2007.

Para. 23: requests within 60 days a report from the Director General of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) on whether Iran has established full and sustained suspension of all activities mentioned in the resolution, as well as on the process of Iranian compliance with all the steps required by the IAEA Board of Governors and with the other provisions of this resolution, to the IAEA Board and in parallel to the Security Council for its consideration.

The report of the IAEA Director General is expected to be submitted by 23 February 2007.

Para. 24: affirms that the Security Council shall review Iran's actions in the light of the report referred to in paragraph 23 above, to be submitted within 60 days.
