**TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE
SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH 2010**

For information only/not an official document

This tentative forecast of the programme of work of the Security Council has been prepared by the Secretariat for the President of the Council. The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

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AFRICA

Chad, the Central African Republic and the subregion – MINURCAT

Resolution 1861 (2009) of 14 January 2009

Para. 28: requests the Secretary-General to continue to report at least every 3 months on the security and humanitarian situation, on progress in the implementation of the relevant agreements, on progress towards the fulfillment of the benchmarks set out in paragraphs 25 and 26 of the resolution, on the implementation of the mandate of the United Nations Mission in the Central African Republic and Chad (MINURCAT), and on the military situation.

Para. 29: requests the Secretary-General to inform the Security Council in his upcoming reports on the development of a strategic workplan containing indicative timelines to measure and track progress on the implementation of the benchmarks in paragraphs 25 and 26 of the resolution.

The Secretary-General is expected to report to the Security Council during March 2010.

Para. 2: decides to extend until 15 March 2010 the mandate of MINURCAT.

The mandate of MINURCAT will expire on 15 March 2010.

Côte d'Ivoire – UNOCI and French forces

Resolution 1911 (2010) of 28 January 2010

Para. 22: requests the Secretary-General to provide to it an update by mid-March 2010 concerning the situation in Côte d'Ivoire and future of the United Nations Operation in Côte d'Ivoire (UNOCI).

The update by the Secretary-General is expected to be provided to the Security Council by mid-March 2010.

Guinea-Bissau – UNIOGBIS

Resolution 1876 (2009) of 26 June 2009

Para. 6: requests the Secretary-General to develop a strategic workplan with appropriate benchmarks to measure and track progress on the implementation of the mandate, described in paragraph 3 of the resolution, of the United Nations Integrated Peacebuilding Office in Guinea-Bissau (UNIOGBIS), and to report on its implementation in accordance with paragraph 14 of the resolution.

Para. 14: requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council regularly informed every 4 months on progress with establishing UNIOGBIS.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 26 February 2010 (S/2010/106) is before the Security Council.

Liberia – UNMILResolution 1885 (2009) of 15 September 2009

Para. 7: requests the Secretary-General, following consultations with the Government of Liberia, to develop and submit to the Security Council a strategic integrated plan to coordinate activity towards the achievement of benchmarks, and requests the Secretary-General to provide in his reports an indication of progress towards achieving a coordinated United Nations approach in Liberia and in particular on critical gaps to achieving peacebuilding objectives.

Para. 9: requests the Secretary-General to continue to monitor progress on core benchmarks, in particular on progress on preparations for the 2011 elections, and on the progress made towards building the capability of the Liberia National Police, and to report regularly on that progress to the Security Council.

Para. 11: requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council regularly informed of the situation on the ground.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 17 February 2010 (S/2010/88) is before the Security Council.

Sierra Leone – UNIPSILResolution 1886 (2009) of 15 September 2009

Para. 8: requests that the Secretary-General keep the Security Council informed every 6 months on progress made in the implementation of the mandate of the United Nations Integrated Peacebuilding Office in Sierra Leone (UNIPSIL), and the present resolution.

Para 4: calls upon the Secretary-General to develop a set of benchmarks for the transition of UNIPSIL into a UN Country Team presence, taking into account those already agreed upon by the government and the UN in the Joint Vision for Sierra Leone, and the particular challenges involved in preparing for the 2012 elections, to keep these under active review, and regularly report on progress to the Security Council.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by mid-March 2010.

Somalia – sanctionsResolution 1844 (2008) of 20 November 2008

Para. 11(g): decides that the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 751 (1992) shall report at least every 120 days to the Council on its work and on the implementation of resolution 1844 (2008), with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraphs 1, 3 and 7 of the resolution.

The Chairman of the 751 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council during March 2010.

Somalia – Monitoring GroupResolution 1853 (2008) of 19 December 2008

Para. 3: decides to extend the mandate of the Monitoring Group referred to in paragraph 3 of resolution 1558 (2004), and requests the Secretary-General to take the necessary administrative measures as expeditiously as possible to re-establish the Monitoring Group for a period of 12 months.

The mandate of the Monitoring Team will expire on 20 March 2010.

Para. 3 (j): to submit, for the Security Council's consideration, through the Committee established pursuant to resolution 751 (1992), a final report covering all the tasks set out in this resolution, no later than 15 days prior to the termination of the Monitoring Group's mandate.

The final report of the Monitoring Group is expected to be submitted by 5 March 2010.

The Sudan – Sanctions CommitteeResolution 1591 (2005) of 29 March 2005

Para. 3(a) iv.: decides that the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1591 (2005) shall report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work.

The Chairman of the 1591 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council during March 2010.

ASIA**Afghanistan – UNAMA**Resolution 1868 (2009) of 23 March 2009

Para. 3: decides to extend the mandate of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA) until 23 March 2010.

The UNAMA mandate will expire on 23 March 2010.

Para. 36: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council every 3 months on developments in Afghanistan.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by mid-March 2010.

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian questionResolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para. 7: invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

Middle East – Lebanon (resolution 1701 (2006))Resolution 1884 (2009) of 27 August 2009

Para. 6: requests the Secretary-General to continue to report to the Security Council on the implementation of resolution 1701 (2006) every 4 months, or at any time as he deems appropriate.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 26 February 2010 (S/2010/105) is before the Security Council.

EUROPE**Resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999) – UNMIK**Resolution 1244 (1999) of 10 June 1999

Para. 20: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council at regular intervals on the implementation of the resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 31 March 2010.

OTHER**Non-proliferation (Iran)**Resolution 1737 (2006) of 23 December 2006

Para. 18(h): decides that the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1737 (2006) shall report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work and on the implementation of the resolution, with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraphs 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10 and 12 of the resolution.

The Chairman of the 1737 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council during March 2010.
