**TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE  
SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH 2011**

This tentative forecast of the programme of work of the Security Council has been prepared by the Secretariat for the President of the Council. The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

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SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH 2011**

**AFRICA**

**Côte d'Ivoire – UNOCI**

Resolution 1962 (2010) of 20 December 2010

Para. 18: requests the Secretary-General to provide to the Security Council a midterm report no later than 31 March 2011 on the situation on the ground, to include an assessment of the need to extend the temporary personnel deployments to the United Nations Operation in Côte d'Ivoire (UNOCI) authorized by resolution 1942 (2010).

Resolution 1967 (2011) of 19 January 2011

Para. 6: requests the Secretary-General to include a review of the temporary personnel deployments to UNOCI as set out in paragraphs 1, 2 and 5 of this resolution in his midterm review due no later than 31 March 2011.

The mid-term report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 31 March 2011.

**Liberia – UNMIL**

Resolution 1938 (2010) of 15 September 2010

Para. 2: authorizes the United Nations Mission in Liberia (UNMIL) to assist the Liberian Government, as requested, with the 2011 general presidential and legislative elections, by providing logistical support, coordinating international electoral assistance, and supporting Liberian institutions and political parties in creating an atmosphere conducive to the conduct of peaceful elections.

Para. 5: encourages UNMIL and the Government of Liberia to continue to make progress in the transition planning process, especially towards conducting a comprehensive situational assessment and identifying critical gaps that need to be filled in order to facilitate a successful transition, and requests that the Secretary-General draw up, in coordination with the Government of Liberia, a joint transition plan on the transfer of responsibility for internal security from UNMIL to the appropriate national authorities and brief regularly on its progress and if applicable its implementation

Para. 9: requests the Secretary-General to continue to monitor progress on core benchmarks, in particular on preparations for the 2011 elections, and on building the capability of the Liberia National Police, and in that regard, requests the Secretary-General to ensure that UNMIL's police component has the required specialized expertise, including civilian expertise, in accordance with its mandate, and further requests a revision of current benchmarks to include transition benchmarks, and to report regularly on that progress to the Security Council.

Para. 11: requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council regularly informed of the situation on the ground as Liberia enters this next critical phase, and to provide by 15 February 2011 a midterm report on the issues addressed in paragraphs 2, 5, and 9 of the resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 14 February 2011 (S/2011/72) is before the Security Council.

### **Sierra Leone – UNIPSIL**

#### Resolution 1941 (2010) of 29 September 2010

Para. 6: calls upon the Secretary-General to continue to report on progress achieved towards meeting the benchmarks, including in supporting the capacity of key national institutions to be able to adequately address the causes of conflict and manage political disputes by themselves, for the transition of the United Nations Integrated Peacebuilding Office in Sierra Leone (UNIPSIL) into a UN Country Team as agreed upon by the Government and the United Nations in the Joint Vision for Sierra Leone, and the particular challenges involved in preparing for the 2012 elections.

Para. 11: requests that the Secretary-General keep the Council informed every 6 months of progress made in the implementation of the mandate of UNIPSIL and this resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by mid-March 2011.

### **Somalia / Eritrea – sanctions**

#### Resolution 1844 (2008) of 20 November 2008

Para. 11(g): decides that the Security Council Committee pursuant to resolutions 751(1992) and 1907 (2009) shall report at least every 120 days to the Council on its work and on the implementation of resolution 1844 (2008), with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraphs 1, 3 and 7 of the resolution.

The Chairman of the 751/1907 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council during March 2011.

#### Resolution 1916 (2010) of 19 March 2010

Para. 11: requests the United Nations Humanitarian Aid Coordinator for Somalia to report every 120 days to the Security Council on the implementation of paragraphs 4 and 5 of the resolution and on any impediments to the delivery of humanitarian assistance in Somalia,

The UN Humanitarian Aid Coordinator for Somalia is expected to report to the Security Council during March 2011.

Para. 5: decides that for a period of 12 months from the date of this resolution, the obligations imposed on Member States in paragraph 3 of resolution 1844 (2008) shall not apply to the payment of funds, other financial assets or economic resources necessary to ensure the timely delivery of urgently needed humanitarian assistance in Somalia, by the United Nations, its specialized agencies or programmes, humanitarian organizations having observer status with the General Assembly that provide humanitarian assistance, or their implementing partners, and decides to review the effects of this paragraph every 120 days based on all available information, including the report of the Humanitarian Aid Coordinator submitted under paragraph 11 of the resolution.

The review by the Security Council is expected to take place during March 2011.

Mandate referred to in paragraph 5 of resolution 1916 expires on 18 March 2011.

### **The Sudan – Panel of Experts**

#### Resolution 1945 (2010) of 14 October 2010

Para. 3: requests the Panel of Experts to provide no later than 31 March 2011 a midterm briefing on its work and no later than 90 days after adoption of this resolution an interim report to the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1591 (2005).

Para. 4: requests the Panel of Experts to assess in its interim report progress towards reducing violations by all parties of the measures imposed by paragraphs 7 and 8 of resolution 1556 (2005) and paragraph 7 of resolution 1591 (2005), and progress towards removing impediments to the political process, threats to stability in Darfur and the region, violations of international humanitarian or human rights law or other atrocities, including sexual- and gender-based violence, and other violations of the above-mentioned resolutions.

The interim report of the Panel of Experts is expected to be submitted to the 1591 Committee by 31 March 2011.

### **The Sudan – Sanctions Committee**

#### Resolution 1591 (2005) of 29 March 2005

Para. 3(a)(iv): decides that the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1591 (2005) shall report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work.

The Chairman of the 1591 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council in early March 2011.

## **ASIA**

### **Afghanistan – UNAMA**

#### Resolution 1917 (2010) of 22 March 2010

Para. 3: decides to extend the mandate of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA) until 23 March 2011.

The UNAMA mandate will expire on 23 March 2011.

Para. 4: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council every 3 months on developments in Afghanistan.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by mid-March 2011.

### **Iraq – UNAMI**

#### Resolution 1936 (2010) of 5 August 2010

Para. 6: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council every 4 months on the progress made towards the fulfillment of all of the responsibilities of the United Nations Assistance Mission for Iraq (UNAMI).

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 31 March 2011.

### **The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question**

#### Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para. 7: invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

**Middle East – Lebanon (resolution 1701 (2006))**Resolution 1937 (2010) of 30 August 2010

Para. 10: requests the Secretary-General to continue to report to the Security Council on the implementation of resolution 1701 (2006) every 4 months, or at any time as he deems appropriate.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 28 February 2011 (S/2011/91) is before the Security Council.

**EUROPE****Cyprus – good offices**S/PRST/2008/34 of 4 September 2008

Last para.: looks forward to being briefed on the progress of the good offices process.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in early March 2011.

**OTHER****Non-proliferation (Iran)**Resolution 1737 (2006) of 23 December 2006

Para. 18(h): decides that the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1737 (2006) shall report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work and on the implementation of the resolution, with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraphs 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10 and 12 of the resolution.

The Chairman of the 1737 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council during March 2011.

**Peacebuilding Commission – Annual Report**Resolution 1646 (2005) of 20 December 2005

Para. 2: decides that the annual report of the Peacebuilding Commission referred to in paragraph 15 of resolution 1645 (2005) shall also be submitted to the Security Council for an annual debate.

Resolution 1947 (2010) of 29 October 2010

Para. 24: requests the Peacebuilding Commission to reflect in its annual reports progress made in taking forward the relevant recommendations of the report presented by the co-facilitators (S/2010/393).

The annual report of the Peacebuilding Commission (A/65/701–S/2011/41) is before the Security Council.
