The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

**AFRICA**

**Central African Republic – EU operation authorization**

Resolution 2181 (2014) of 21 October 2014

Para.1: Decides to extend the authorization of the European Union operation contained in paragraph 44 of resolution 2134 (2014) until 15 March 2015;

**Democratic Republic of the Congo – MONUSCO**

Resolution 2147 (2014) of 28 March 2014

Para.1: Decides to extend the mandate of MONUSCO in the DRC, including, on an exceptional basis and without creating a precedent or any prejudice to the agreed principles of peacekeeping, its Intervention Brigade, within the authorized troop ceiling of 19,815 military personnel, 760 military observers and staff officers, 391 police personnel, 1050 personnel of formed police units, until 31 March 2015;

The mandate of MONUSCO will expire on 31 March 2015.

A meeting between the Security Council and the troop-contributing countries will take place before the expiry of the MONUSCO mandate.

Para.40: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council every three months on:

- (i) the situation on the ground, including sexual violence and the impact of conflict on women and children;
- (ii) progress made by the DRC in the implementation of its commitments under the PSC Framework, including through the establishment and implementation of a national security sector reform roadmap and the creation of a Congolese “Rapid Reaction Force”, and on the implementation of the DDR and DDRRR plans;
- (iii) the implementation by MONUSCO of its mandate, including the activities of the Intervention brigade, its reconfiguration to conduct the tasks set out above and the ongoing transfer of responsibilities to other actors;
- (iv) the risks and their implications for the safety and the security for the UN personnel and facilities as a result of the possible military operations as well as measures taken to strengthen their security and mitigate risks;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in March 2015.

**Democratic Republic of the Congo – Implementation of commitments under PSC Framework**

Resolution 2147 (2014) of 28 March 2014

Para.41: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council every six months, in coordination with his Special Envoy for the Great Lakes region and his Special Representative for the DRC on the implementation of the commitments under the PSC Framework;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in March 2015.

## **Liberia – UNMIL**

### Resolution 2190 (2014) of 15 December 2014

Para.17: Requests the Secretary-General to provide an update no later than 15 March 2015 on the situation in Liberia, especially an assessment of the impact of the Ebola outbreak on the stability of Liberia and options for resuming the drawdown in line with the objective of completing the security transition as referred to in paragraph 5 above and recognizes that the modalities of the resumption of the phased drawdown, referred to in paragraph 16 above, may require adjustments in light of this update;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in March 2015.

## **Libya – UNSMIL**

### Resolution 2144 (2014) of 14 March 2014

Para.6: Decides to extend the mandate of the United Nations Support Mission in Libya (UNSMIL) until 13 March 2015 under the leadership of a Special Representative of the Secretary-General, and decides further that the mandate of UNSMIL as an integrated special political mission, in full accordance with the principles of national ownership, shall be to support Libyan government efforts to:

The mandate of UNSMIL will expire on 13 March 2015.

Para.18: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the implementation of this resolution, including all elements of UNSMIL's mandate, every 90 days;

The report of the Secretary-General dated 26 February 2015 (S/2015/144) is before the Security Council.

## **Libya – Sanctions: Committee reports**

### Resolution 1970 (2011) of 26 February 2011

Para.24: Decides to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional rules of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council consisting of all the members of the Council (herein "the Committee"), to undertake the following tasks:

(e) To report within thirty days to the Security Council on its work for the first report and thereafter to report as deemed necessary by the Committee.

The Chair of the 1970 Committee is expected to report in March 2015.

## **Libya – Sanctions: Authorization of additional measures against vessels designated by the 1970 Committee**

### Resolution 2146 (2014) of 19 March 2014

Para.15: Decides that the authorizations provided by and the measures imposed by this resolution shall terminate one year from the date of the adoption of this resolution, unless the Council decides to extend them;

The authorizations provided by and the measures imposed will terminate by 19 March 2015.

## **Libya – Sanctions: Panel of Experts mandate and reports**

### Resolution 2144 (2014) of 14 March 2014

Para.13: Decides to extend until 13 April 2015 the mandate of the Panel of Experts, established by paragraph 24 of resolution 1973 (2011) and modified by resolution 2040 (2012), expresses its intent to review the mandate and take appropriate action regarding further extension no later than twelve months from the adoption of this resolution, and decides that the Panel shall carry out the following tasks:

The mandate of the Panel of Experts is expected to be reviewed no later than 14 March 2015.

Para.14: (d) Provide to the Council an interim report on its work no later than 180 days after the Panel's appointment, and a final report to the Council, after discussion with the Committee, no later than 10 March 2015 with its findings and recommendations;

The letter from the Coordinator of the Panel of Experts dated 23 February 2015 (S/2015/128) is before the Security Council.

## **Mali – MINUSMA**

### Resolution 2164 (2014) of 25 June 2014

Para.33: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council within three months of the adoption of this resolution, focusing on the implementation of the Ouagadougou Preliminary Agreement, the expansion of the Force's presence in the North of Mali, and benchmarks to assess progress on the implementation of the priority tasks of MINUSMA's mandate, as defined by paragraph 13 above, and then, every three months, to report on the implementation of this resolution, in particular on the progress achieved on the benchmarks;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in March 2015.

## **Mali – Report by France on implementation of mandate to support MINUSMA**

### Resolution 2164 (2014) of 25 June 2014

Para.26: Authorizes French forces, within the limits of their capacities and areas of deployment, to use all necessary means until the end of MINUSMA's mandate as authorized in this resolution, to intervene in support of elements of MINUSMA when under imminent and serious threat upon request of the Secretary-General, requests France to report to the Council on the implementation of this mandate in Mali and to coordinate its reporting with the reporting by the Secretary-General referred to in paragraph 33 below;

## **Somalia – Sanctions: Somali Government reports**

### Resolution 2182 (2014) of 24 October 2014

Para.9: Urges the FGS to implement fully all its requirements as set out in this and other relevant Security Council resolutions, and requests the FGS to report to the Security Council by 30 March 2015, and then by 30 September 2015 on:

- (a) The current structure of the Security Forces of the Federal Government of Somalia;
- (b) The infrastructure in place to ensure the safe storage, registration, maintenance and distribution of military equipment by the Security Forces of the Federal Government of Somalia;
- (c) The procedures and codes of conduct in place for the registration, distribution, use and storage of weapons by the Security Forces of the Federal Government of Somalia, and on training needs in this regard;

## **Somalia – AU reports on AMISOM**

### Resolution 2093 (2013) of 6 March 2013

Para.8: Requests the AU to keep the Security Council regularly informed on the implementation of AMISOM's mandate through the provision of written reports to the Secretary-General every 90 days after the adoption of this resolution.

## **Sudan – UNAMID**

### Resolution 2173 (2014) of 27 August 2014

Para.7: Requests the Secretary-General, in close consultation with the AU, and seeking perspectives from all relevant parties, to conduct an analysis of implementation of the review of UNAMID, including specific achievements reached under the revised strategic priorities, progress in addressing the challenges facing the Mission, as identified by the review, any significant developments in the situation in Darfur and their impact on UNAMID's mandate and tasks, and an analysis of those tasks that remain relevant and on the fulfilment of which the UNCT has comparative advantage, with a road map to transfer those tasks to the fullest extent possible to the UNCT, taking into account the contributions of donors and other relevant actors; requests that he present this analysis, together with recommendations for the future mandate, composition, configuration and exit strategy of UNAMID, as well as for its relationship with other UN actors in Darfur and Sudan, by 28 February 2015; and expresses its intention to take decisions accordingly on the future of UNAMID and to make necessary changes fully and promptly following presentation of the Secretary-General's analysis and recommendations;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in early March 2015.

Para.26: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council every 90 days following adoption of this resolution on UNAMID, including: information on the political, humanitarian and security situation in Darfur, including detailed reporting on incidents of violence and attacks against civilians, by whomsoever perpetrated; information on violations of the Status of Forces Agreement, as well as violations of international humanitarian law perpetrated by any party to the conflict; developments and progress towards achievement of UNAMID's strategic priorities and benchmarks; developments and progress in addressing the challenges facing UNAMID as identified in the review of UNAMID; and on the implementation of this resolution;

The report of the Secretary-General dated 26 February 2015 (S/2015/141) is before the Security Council.

## **Sudan/South Sudan – Status of compliance with resolution 2046 (2012)**

### Resolution 2046 (2012) of 2 May 2012

Para.6: Requests the Secretary-General to consult with the African Union on the implementation of this resolution and the decisions of the AU PSC, to work closely with the AUHIP in support of its facilitation efforts, and to inform the Security Council within 15 days and in two week intervals thereafter on the status of compliance by Sudan, South Sudan, and the SPLM-N with the decisions set forth in this resolution, and expresses its intention, in the event that any or all of the parties have not complied with the decisions set forth in this resolution, to take appropriate additional measures under Article 41 of the Charter as necessary.

Note by the President of 11 November 2013 (S/2013/657)

Following consultations among the members of the Security Council, it has been agreed that issues pertaining to the Sudan and South Sudan, including the African Union/United Nations Hybrid Operation in Darfur (UNAMID), the United Nations Interim Security Force for Abyei (UNISFA), the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS) and Council resolution 2046 (2012), will, as from 11 November 2013, be considered under the agenda item entitled "Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan and South Sudan". In addition, members of the Security Council agreed to amend the reporting period established in paragraph 6 of resolution 2046 (2012) to one-month intervals.

Note by the President of 21 August 2014 (S/2014/613)

Following consultations among the members of the Security Council, it has been agreed to amend the reporting period established in paragraph 6 of resolution 2046 (2012) and subsequently amended in a note by the President of the Security Council (S/2013/657) to three-month intervals.

The Secretary-General is expected to report to the Security Council in March 2015.

## AMERICAS

### Haiti – MINUSTAH

Resolution 2180 (2014) of 14 October 2014

Para.28: Requests the Secretary-General to keep it regularly informed, and to report to the Council on the implementation of MINUSTAH's mandate, semi-annually and not later than forty-five days prior to its expiration;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in March 2015.

## ASIA/MIDDLE EAST

### Afghanistan – UNAMA

Resolution 2145 (2014) of 17 March 2014

Para.3: Decides to extend until 17 March 2015 the mandate of UNAMA, as defined in its resolutions 1662 (2006), 1746 (2007), 1806 (2008), 1868 (2009), 1917 (2010), 1974 (2011), 2041 (2012) and 2096 (2013), and paragraphs 4, 5, 6 and 7 below;

The mandate of UNAMA will expire on 17 March 2015.

Para.44: ...and requests the Secretary-General to continue to include in his reports to the Security Council relevant information on the process of integration of women into the political, economic and social life of Afghanistan;

Para.48: Requests that the Secretary-General reports to the Council every three months on developments in Afghanistan, and to include in his reports an evaluation of progress made against the benchmarks for measuring and tracking progress in the implementation of UNAMA's mandate, including at the subnational level, and priorities as set out in this resolution;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in March 2015.

### **Iraq – Escrow account (oil for food termination)**

Resolution 1958 (2010) of 15 December 2010

Para.8: Requests the Secretary-General to report and provide analysis to the Council on the usage and expenditure of the escrow account referenced in paragraphs 4 and 5 on an annual basis, the first no later than 31 March 2012, with the final report occurring three months after the transfer of any remaining funds retained for the purposes of paragraphs 4 and 5 to the Government of Iraq by 31 December 2016, unless otherwise authorized by the Security Council.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in March 2015.

### **The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question**

Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para.7: Invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Council informed.

### **Middle East (Lebanon/UNIFIL) – Implementation of resolution 1701 (2006)**

Resolution 2172 (2014) of 26 August 2014

Para.12: Requests the Secretary-General to continue to report to the Council on the implementation of resolution 1701 (2006), every four months, or at any time as he deems appropriate.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 27 February 2015 (S/2015/147) is before the Security Council.

### **Middle East (Syria) – OPCW report to SC (through SG) on implementation of resolution 2118 (2013)**

Resolution 2118 (2013) of 27 September 2013

Para.12: Decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall include relevant information on United Nations activities related to the implementation of this resolution, within 30 days and every month thereafter, and requests further the Director-General of the OPCW and the Secretary-General to report in a coordinated manner, as needed, to the Security Council, non-compliance with this resolution or the OPCW Executive Council decision of 27 September 2013.

The letter of the Secretary-General dated 25 February 2015 (S/2015/138) is before the Security Council.

### **Middle East (Syria) – Implementation of resolutions 2139 (2014), 2165 (2014) and 2191 (2014)**

Resolution 2139 (2014) of 22 February 2014

Para.17: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution by all parties in Syria, in particular paragraphs 2 through 12, in 30 days of its adoption and every 30 days thereafter, and upon receipt of the Secretary-General's report, expresses its intent to take further steps in the case of non-compliance with this resolution;

Resolution 2191 (2014) of 17 December 2014

Para. 5: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution, and on compliance by all parties to the Syrian domestic conflict, within the framework of its reporting on resolutions 2139 (2014) and 2165 (2014);

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in March 2015.

### **Middle East – UNDOF**

Resolution 2192 (2014) of 18 December 2014

Para.8: Requests the Secretary-General to report every 90 days on developments in the situation and the measures taken to implement resolution 338 (1973).

The Secretary-General is expected to report in March 2015.

### **Middle East (Yemen) – SG to report on the implementation of resolution 2201 (2015) and on developments in Yemen**

Resolution 2201 (2015) of 15 February 2015

Para. 13: Requests the Secretary-General to report on the implementation of this resolution, and to continue to report on developments in Yemen, including on the implementation of the Gulf Cooperation Council Initiative and its Implementation Mechanism, the outcomes of the comprehensive National Dialogue conference, and the Peace and National Partnership Agreement and its security annex within 15 days after the date of adoption of this resolution and every 60 days thereafter;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in March 2015.

## **OTHER**

### **Non-proliferation (Iran) – Sanctions: Committee reports**

Resolution 1737 (2006) of 27 December 2006

Para.18: Decides to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional rules of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council consisting of all the members of the Council, to undertake the following tasks:

(h) to report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work and on the implementation of this resolution, with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraphs 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10 and 12 above.

The Chair of the 1737 Committee is expected to report in March 2015.

### **Non-proliferation/DPRK – Sanctions: Panel of Experts mandate**

Resolution 2141 (2014) of 5 March 2014

Para.1: Decides to extend until 5 April 2015 the mandate of the Panel of Experts, as specified in paragraph 26 of resolution 1874 (2009) and modified in paragraph 29 of resolution 2094 (2013), expresses its intent to review the mandate and take appropriate action regarding further extension no later than 5 March 2015, and requests the Secretary General to take the necessary administrative measures to this effect;

The mandate of the Panel of Experts is expected to be reviewed no later than 5 March 2015.

## **Cooperation between UN and regional / subregional organizations - Briefings by the EU High Representative**

S/PRST/2014/4 of 14 February 2014

Last para.: “The Security Council welcomes the close cooperation between the United Nations and the European Union and encourages both organizations to further strengthen their institutional relations and strategic partnership, including through regular briefings by the European Union High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy to the Security Council.”

## **Women and peace and security – Annual reports on the implementation of resolutions on WPS and resolution 2106 (2013)**

Resolution 2106 (2013) of 24 June 2013

Para.22: Requests that the Secretary-General continue to submit annual reports to the Council on the implementation of women and peace and security resolutions and the present resolution, and to submit his next report by March 2014;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in March 2015.

## **Peacekeeping operations – Report and recommendations on the progress of partnerships between the UN and relevant regional organizations in peacekeeping operations**

Resolution 2167 (2014) of 28 July 2014

Para.28: Requests the Secretary-General, in close consultation with the AU Commission and EU to produce, not later than 31 March 2015, an assessment report and recommendations on the progress of the partnerships between the UN and relevant regional organizations in peacekeeping operations;

The report and recommendations of the Secretary-General are expected to be submitted no later than 31 March 2015.

## **Peacekeeping operations – Lessons learned exercise on transitions and specific recommendations**

Resolution 2167 (2014) of 28 July 2014

Para.13: Requests in that context the Secretary-General to initiate in full and close cooperation with the African Union a lessons learned exercise on the transitions from the African Union peace operations to United Nations peacekeeping operations in Mali and the Central African Republic and to produce specific recommendations that could be used for possible future transitional arrangements not later than 31 December 2014;

The letter of the Secretary-General dated 2 January 2015 (S/2015/3) is before the Security Council.

## **Cooperation between UN and regional / subregional organizations – Recommendations on enhancing cooperation between the UN and OIC**

Resolution 1809 (2008) of 16 April 2008

Para.17: Requests the Secretary-General to include in his regular reporting to the Security Council, assessments of progress on the cooperation between the United Nations and relevant regional organizations;

S/PRST/2013/12 of 6 August 2013

Last para.: The Council further requests that the Secretary-General includes in his next biannual report to the Security Council and the General Assembly on Cooperation between the United Nations and regional and other organizations, recommendations on ways to enhance cooperation between the United Nations and relevant regional and subregional organizations and arrangements.

S/PRST/2013/16 of 28 October 2013

Last para: "The Security Council requests the Secretary-General to include in his next biannual report to the Security Council and the General Assembly on Cooperation between the United Nations and regional and other organizations, recommendations on ways to enhance cooperation between the United Nations and the Organization of Islamic Cooperation."

The report of the Secretary-General dated 4 August 2014 (S/2014/560) is before the Security Council.
