This tentative forecast of the programme of work of the Security Council has been prepared by the Secretariat for the President of the Council. The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF MAY 2007

AFRICA

Burundi - BINUB

Resolution 1719 (2006) of 25 October 2006

Para. 14: requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council <u>regularly informed</u> of the progress made in establishing the United Nations Integrated Office in Burundi (BINUB) and on the implementation of the resolution, including with respect to the security situation and the human rights situation.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 9 May 2007.

Côte d'Ivoire

S/PRST/2007/8 of 28 March 2007

Last para.: requests the Secretary-General to submit to the Security Council <u>by 15 May 2007</u> recommendations on the role that the United Nations should play to support the implementation of the peace process, taking into account the latest developments in Côte d'Ivoire.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 15 May 2007.

Democratic Republic of the Congo – MONUC

Resolution 1751 (2007) of 13 April 2007

Para. 1: decides to extend the mandate and personnel strength of the United Nations Organization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUC), as set out in its resolutions 1565 (2004), 1592 (2005), 1596 (2005), 1621 (2005), 1635 (2005) and 1763 (2006), until 15 May 2007.

The mandate of MONUC and the authorized personnel increases will expire on 15 May 2007.

Resolution 1742 (2007) of 15 February 2007

Para. 2: requests the Secretary-General to report, as soon as possible and <u>not later than 15 March 2007</u>, on his consultations with the Congolese authorities and to submit recommendations on adjustments the Council may consider making to the mandate and capacities of MONUC.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 20 March 2007 (S/2007/156) is before the Security Council.

Eritrea/Ethiopia – UNMEE

Resolution 1741 (2007) of 30 January 2007

Para. 13: requests the Secretary-General to include in his next progress report <u>due by the end of April 2007</u>, details of the progress made towards the implementation of the resolution and the implementation of the Eritrea-Ethiopia Boundary Commission decision.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in early May 2007.

Sierra Leone - UNIOSIL

Resolution 1734 (2006) of 22 December 2006

Para. 3: calls upon the Secretary-General to conduct a comprehensive assessment of the role of the United Nations Integrated Office in Sierra Leone (UNIOSIL), closer to the election date, with view to developing its exit strategy.

Para. 12: requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council <u>regularly informed</u> of progress made in the implementation of the UNIOSIL mandate and this resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 3 May 2007.

The Sudan - Darfur

Resolution 1590 (2005) of 24 March 2005

Para.12: requests that the Secretary-General continue to report on a monthly basis on the situation in Darfur.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued during May 2007.

AMERICAS

Haiti - MINUSTAH

Resolution 1743 (2007) of 15 February 2007

Para. 23: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the implementation of MINUSTAH's mandate <u>semi-annually</u> but not later than 45 days prior to its expiration.

An oral update may be given during May 2007.

ASIA

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question

By paragraph 7 of resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000, the Security Council invited the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Council informed.

Middle East (Lebanon) - resolution 1559 (2004)

S/PRST/2004/36 of 19 October 2004

Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council <u>every six months</u> on the implementation by the parties of resolution 1559 (2004).

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in early May 2007.

Letter dated 22 November 2006 from the Secretary-General – UNMIN

Resolution 1740 (2007) of 23 January 2007

Para. 4: requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council <u>regularly informed</u> of progress in implementing this resolution, by which the Council decided to establish the United Nations political mission in Nepal (UNMIN).

The report of the Secretary-General dated 26 April 2007 (S/2007/235) is before the Security Council.

EUROPE

Bosnia and Herzegovina – Peace Agreement

Resolution 1722 (2006) of 21 November 2006

Para. 21: requests the Secretary-General to continue to submit to the Security Council reports from the High Representative, in accordance with Annex 10 of the Peace Agreement and the conclusions of the Peace Implementation Conference held in London on 4 and 5 December 1996 (S/1996/1012) and later Peace Implementation Conferences, on the implementation of the Peace Agreement.

The report of the High Representative is expected to be issued by 9 May 2007.

Resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999) Security Council mission on the Kosovo issue

The head of the Security Council mission on the Kosovo issue, from 25 to 29 April 2007, is expected to give an oral briefing on the mission in early May 2007.

The Security Council is expected to consider the written report of the mission <u>during rnid-May 2007</u>.

S/PRST/2005/51 of 24 October 2005

Requests that the Secretary-General provide <u>regular updates</u> on progress in determining the future status of Kosovo, as defined by resolution 1244 (1999).

The report of the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General dated 26 March 2007 (S/2007/168) and the Comprehensive Proposal for the Kosovo Status Settlement (S/2007/168/Add.1) are before the Security Council.

OTHER

Coordinated reporting by Chairmen of counter-terrorism committees S/PRST/2005/34 of 20 July 2005

Invites the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999) concerning Al-Qaida and the Taliban and associated individuals and entities, the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1373 (2001) concerning counter-terrorism (CTC), and the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1540 (2004) to continue reporting on their activities at regular intervals and, where appropriate, in a coordinated manner.

S/PRST/2006/56 of 20 December 2006

Calls on the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1373 (2001) concerning counterterrorism to report on the status of implementation of resolution 1373 (2001) and encourages the Committee particularly to report to the Council on any outstanding issues, when necessary and <u>on a regular basis</u>, in order to receive strategic guidance from the Council.

Resolution 1735 (2006) of 22 December 2006

Para. 31: requests the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999) concerning Al-Qaida and the Taliban and associated individuals and entities to report orally, through its Chairman, to the Security Council <u>at least every 180 days</u> on the overall work of the Committee and the Analytical Support and Sanctions Monitoring Team, and, as appropriate, <u>in conjunction with the reports by the Chairmen of the CTC and of the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1540 (2004).</u>

The Chairmen of the Committees established pursuant to resolutions 1267 (1999), 1373 (2001) and 1540 (2004) are expected to give a joint briefing to the Security Council <u>during</u> May 2007.

Non-proliferation / Iran

Resolution 1747 (2007) of 24 March 2007

Para. 12: requests within 60 days a further report from the Director General of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) on whether Iran has established full and sustained suspension of all activities mentioned in resolution 1737 (2006), as well as on the process of Iranian compliance with all the steps required by the IAEA Board of Governors and with the other provisions of resolution 1737 (2006) and of this resolution, to the IAEA Board of Governors and in parallel to the Security Council for its consideration.

Para. 13: affirms that the Security Council shall review Iran's actions in light of the report referred to in paragraph 12.

The report of the IAEA Director General is expected to be submitted by 23 May 2007.

Para. 8: calls upon all States to report to the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1737 (2006) within 60 days of the adoption of the resolution on the steps they have taken with a view to implementing effectively paragraphs 2, 4, 5, 6 and 7 of the resolution.

All States are expected to report to the 1737 Committee by 23 May 2007.
