# TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF JULY 2010

This tentative forecast of the programme of work of the Security Council has been prepared by the Secretariat for the President of the Council. The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

# TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF JULY 2010

#### **AFRICA**

# Chad, the Central African Republic and the subregion – MINURCAT Resolution 1923 (2010) of 25 May 2010

Para. 25: requests the Secretary-General to continue keep the Security Council regularly informed and requests him to provide a report <u>by 31 July 2010</u> on the security and humanitarian situation, including movements of refugees and internally displaced persons in eastern Chad and the north-eastern Central African Republic, on the progress in the implementation of the relevant agreements, on the progress towards the fulfilment by the Government of Chad of the tasks and benchmarks set out in paragraphs 2 and 3 of this resolution, including on the measures adopted in response to possible shortcomings identified by the joint high-level Working Group referred to in paragraph 4, and on the implementation of the mandate of the United Nations Mission in the Central African Republic and Chad (MINURCAT), and stresses that the Security Council will monitor closely the relevance of the mandate of MINURCAT and review it if necessary.

Para. 26: requests the Secretary-General, <u>in his July report</u>, to provide an assessment on international and regional options for the Central African Republic, based on his evaluation of the consequences of MINURCAT's departure.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 31 July 2010.

## **Democratic Republic of the Congo - MONUSCO**

Resolution 1925 (2010) of 28 May 2010

Para 1: decides that, in view of the new phase that has been reached in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, the United Nations mission in that country shall, <u>as from 1 July 2010</u>, bear the title of the United Nations Organization Stabilization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUSCO).

#### Guinea-Bissau - UNIOGBIS

Resolution 1876 (2009) of 26 June 2009

Para. 6: requests the Secretary-General to develop a strategic workplan with appropriate benchmarks to measure and track progress on the implementation of the mandate, described in paragraph 3 of the resolution, of the United Nations Integrated Peacebuilding Office in Guinea-Bissau (UNIOGBIS), and to report on its implementation in accordance with paragraph 14 of the resolution.

Para. 14: requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council regularly informed every 4 months on the implementation of this resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 24 June 2010 (S/2010/335) is before the Security Council.

#### Liberia – sanctions

# Resolution 1903 (2009) of 17 December 2009

Para. 9(f): decides that the Panel of Experts shall provide a midterm report to the Security Council through the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1521 (2003) by 1 June 2010.

The Chairman of the 1521 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council <u>during July 2010</u>

# Peace and security in Africa – Eritrea

Resolution 1907 (2009) of 23 December 2009

Para. 22: requests the Secretary-General to report <u>within 180 days</u> on Eritrea's compliance with the provisions of this resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 22 June 2010 (S/2010/327) is before the Security Council.

#### Somalia / Eritrea – sanctions

Resolution 1844 (2008) of 20 November 2008

Para. 11(g): decides that the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 751 (1992) shall report at least <u>every 120 days</u> to the Council on its work and on the implementation of resolution 1844 (2008), with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraphs 1, 3 and 7 of the resolution.

The Chairman of the 751/1907 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council <u>during</u> <u>July 2010</u>

#### Resolution 1916 (2010) of 19 March 2010

Para. 11: requests the UN Humanitarian Aid Coordinator for Somalia to report <u>every 120 days</u> to the Security Council on the implementation of paragraphs 4 and 5 of the resolution and on any impediments to the delivery of humanitarian assistance in Somalia.

The UN Humanitarian Aid Coordinator for Somalia is expected to report to the Security Council during July 2010.

Para. 5: decides that for a period of 12 months from the date of this resolution, the obligations imposed on Member States in paragraph 3 of resolution 1844 (2008) shall not apply to the payment of funds, other financial assets or economic resources necessary to ensure the timely delivery of urgently needed humanitarian assistance in Somalia, by the United Nations, its specialized agencies or programmes, humanitarian organizations having observer status with the General Assembly that provide humanitarian assistance, or their implementing partners, and decides to review the effects of this paragraph every 120 days based on all available information, including the report of the Humanitarian Aid Coordinator submitted under paragraph 11 of the resolution.

The review by the Security Council is expected to take place during July 2010.

# Somalia – piracy at sea

# Resolution 1918 (2010) of 27 April 2010

Para 4: requests the Secretary-General to present to the Security Council within 3 months a report on possible options to further the aim of prosecuting and imprisoning persons responsible for acts of piracy and armed robbery at sea off the coast of Somalia, including, in particular, options for creating special domestic chambers possibly with international components, a regional tribunal or an international tribunal and corresponding imprisonment arrangements, taking into account the work of the CGPCS, the existing practice in establishing international and mixed tribunals, and the time and the resources necessary to achieve and sustain substantive results.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 27 July 2010.

# The Sudan - UNMIS

## Resolution 1919 (2010) of 29 April 2010

Para. 2: requests the Secretary-General to continue reporting to the Security Council <u>every 3 months</u> on the mandate implementation of the United Nations Mission in the Sudan (UNMIS), implementation progress of the Comprehensive Peace Agreement (CPA), and respect for the ceasefire.

Para. 3: requests the Secretary General to provide in his <u>quarterly reports</u> information including (1) a detailed plan of measures UNMIS is taking to support the referenda and popular consultation processes, consistent with paragraph 7 below, including lessons learned from the 2010 elections, (2) the status of United Nations engagement with the parties to the CPA and the parties' progress concerning the critical tasks that will need to be accomplished post-referendum and, as appropriate, information on (3) UNMIS' planning in consultation with the parties concerning the United Nations presence in the Sudan post Interim period.

Para. 5: requests the Secretary General to include in his UNMIS <u>quarterly reports</u>, information on cooperation between United Nations missions in dealing with the threats of the LRA.

Para. 22: requests the Secretary-General to report on and assess the progress in meeting benchmarks in each <u>quarterly report</u>, as well as any consequent recommendations regarding UNMIS' configuration.

Para. 23: requests the Secretary-General to report on progress against the concepts of operations and rules of engagement to the Security Council and troop-contributing countries in <u>each quarterly report</u>, and to provide the Security Council in the same report specific updates on the security situation in the Mission's area of responsibility.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued during July 2010.

#### The Sudan - UNAMID

#### Resolution 1881 (2009) of 30 July 2009

Para. 6(c): requests the Secretary-General, following consultations with the African Union, to report to the Security Council <u>every 90 days</u> on progress made towards implementing the mandate of the African Union-United Nations Hybrid Operation in Darfur (UNAMID) across

Darfur, as well as on progress on the political process, on the security and humanitarian situation and on all parties compliance with their international obligations.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by mid-July 2010.

Para. 1: decides to extend the mandate of UNAMID for a further 12 months to 31 July 2010.

The UNAMID mandate will expire on 31 July 2010.

A meeting between the Security Council and the troop- and police-contributing countries will take place prior to the expiration of the UNAMID mandate.

# **United Nations Office for West Africa (UNOWA)**

<u>Letter from the Council President to the Secretary-General of 21 December 2007 (S/2007/754)</u> Requests that the Secretary-General report to the Security Council <u>every 6 months</u> on the fulfilment by the United Nations Office for West Africa (UNOWA) of its revised mandate.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 21 June 2010 (S/2010/324) is before the Security Council.

#### **ASIA**

#### Iraq - DFI / IAMB

Resolution 1905 (2009) of 21 December 2009

Para. 3: requests the Secretary-General to provide written reports to the Security Council on a quarterly basis, to include details on progress made in strengthening financial and administrative oversight of the current Development Fund for Iraq (DFI), as well as the legal issues and options to be considered to implement successor arrangements and an assessment of the Government of Iraq's progress in preparing for the successor arrangements for the DFI.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 1 July 2010.

Para. 5: requests the Government of Iraq through the head of the Committee of Financial Experts (COFE) to report to the Security Council on a quarterly basis, to provide an action plan and timeline for the transition from the Development Fund for Iraq and details on the progress made in strengthening financial and administrative oversight of the current DFI.

The report of the Government of Iraq is expected to be transmitted by 1 July 2010.

# The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian Question Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para. 7: invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

#### Middle East – Lebanon (resolution 1701 (2006))

Resolution 1884 (2009) of 27 August 2009

Para. 6: requests the Secretary-General to continue to report to the Security Council on the implementation of resolution 1701 (2006) every 4 months, or at any time as he deems appropriate.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in early July 2010.

#### EUROPE

Resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999) – UNMIK Resolution 1244 (1999) of 10 June 1999

Para. 20: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council <u>at regular intervals</u> on the implementation of the resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 31 July 2010.

#### OTHER

#### Protection of civilians in armed conflict

S/PRST/2002/41 of 20 December 2002

Last para.: welcomes the oral briefings to be given to the Security Council every 6 months.

The next oral briefing is expected to be given <u>during early July 2010</u>.

# Non-proliferation (Iran)

Resolution 1929 (2010) of 9 June 2010

Para. 27: decides that the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1737 (2006) shall intensify its efforts to promote the full implementation of resolutions 1737 (2006), 1747 (2007), 1803 (2008) and this resolution, including through a work programme covering compliance, investigations, outreach, dialogue, assistance and cooperation, to be submitted to the Security Council within 45 days of the adoption of this resolution.

The work programme of the 1737 Committee is expected to be submitted to the Security Council by 24 July 2010.

#### Counter-terrorism – Al-Qaida / Taliban sanctions

Resolution 1822 (2008) of 30 June 2008

Para. 25: directs the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999) concerning Al-Qaida and the Taliban and associated individuals and entities to conduct a review of all names on the Consolidated List at the date of adoption of this resolution by 30 June 2010, in which the relevant names are circulated to the designating States and States of residence and/or citizenship, where known, pursuant to the procedures set forth in the Committee guidelines, in order to ensure the Consolidated List is as updated and accurate as possible and to confirm that listing remains appropriate.

Letter from the President of the Security Council dated 29 June 2010 (S/2010/342) Informs the Chairman of the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1267 (1999) that the members of the Security Council have agreed, in response to the request contained in the letter from the Chairman dated 28 June 2010 (S/2010/341), to extend the deadline for the above review until 31 July 2010.

## Post-conflict peacebuilding

S/PRST/2009/23 of 22 July 2009

Last para.: invites the Secretary-General to report within 12 months to the Security Council and the General Assembly on progress achieved in fulfilling his agenda for action to improve the United Nations' peacebuilding efforts, taking into consideration the views of the Peacebuilding Commission.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 22 July 2010.

#### **Security Council Annual Report**

Note by the President of the Security Council of 19 December 2007 (S/2007/749)

Para. 8: A draft introduction to the Annual Report of the Security Council to the General Assembly should continue to be prepared under the leadership and responsibility of the President of the Council for the month of July of each calendar year.
