**TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE  
SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST 2011**

For information only/not an official document

This tentative forecast of the programme of work of the Security Council has been prepared by the Secretariat for the President of the Council. The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

## TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST 2011

### AFRICA

#### Liberia – (UNMIL)

##### Resolution 1938 (2010) of 15 September 2010

Para. 11: requests the Secretary-General to keep it regularly informed of the situation on the ground as Liberia enters this next critical phase, and to provide by 15 August 2011 a report on the issues addressed in paragraphs 2, 5 and 9 of the resolution;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 15 August 2011.

#### Libya

##### Resolution 1973 (2011) of 17 March 2011

Para. 12: requests the Secretary-General to inform the Council immediately of any actions taken by the Member States concerned in exercise of the authority conferred by paragraph 8 of the resolution and to report to the Council within 7 days and every month thereafter on the implementation of this resolution, including information on any violations of the flight ban imposed by paragraph 6 of the resolution.

The Secretary-General is expected to report to the Security Council on 30 August 2011.

#### Somalia

##### Resolution 1964 (2010) of 22 December 2010

Para. 20 requests the Secretary-General to report on all aspects of this resolution every four months commencing 1 January and expresses its intention to review the situation, as part of his reporting obligations, as specified in the statement of the President of the Security Council of 31 October 2001 (S/PRST/2001/30) and Security Council resolutions 1863 (2009), 1872 (2009) and 1910 (2010).

##### S/PRST/2011/6 of 10 March 2011

The Security Council notes that the transitional period will end in August 2011. The Council urges all Somali stakeholders to participate in this meeting and play a role in finalising arrangements for ending the transition in August 2011. It notes its intention to keep the situation under review.

##### S/PRST/2011/10 of 11 May 2011

The Security Council reiterates its full support to AMISOM and underlines its intention to keep the situation under review.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 30 August 2011.

**United Nations Regional Office for Central Africa (UNOCA)**

Letter from the President of the Security Council dated 30 August 2010 (S/2010/457)

Proposed that the office to be established for an initial period of two years, with a review of its mandate after 18 months.

Requests that the Secretary-General provide regular information about the activities of the office, and once established, report to the Security Council six months after the office becomes fully operational.

**In informal consultations of the whole on 3 June 2011, the SRSG informed Council members that he would be ready to submit the first report on the Office once it became operational.**

**The Secretariat is expected to provide to the Security Council an initial update and with information about the activities of the office on 18 August 2011.**

The report of the Secretary-General six months after the office becomes fully operational is expected to be issued in November 2011.

**AMERICAS**

**Haiti – (MINUSTAH)**

Resolution 1944 (2010) of 14 October 2010

Para. 21: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the implementation of the mandate of the United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti (MINUSTAH) semi-annually.

Para. 22: requests the Secretary-General to include in his reports a comprehensive assessment of threats to security in Haiti and give particular attention to the protective environment for all, in particular women and children, and on progress in the sustainable resettlement of displaced persons, and to propose, as appropriate, options to reconfigure the composition of MINUSTAH.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 31 August 2011.

## ASIA

### **The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian Question**

Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para. 7: invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

### **Middle East (UNIFIL)**

Resolution 1937 (2010) of 30 August 2010

Para. 1: decides to extend the present mandate of UNIFIL until 31 August 2011.

Para. 10: requests the Secretary-General to continue to report to the Council on the implementation of resolution 1701 (2006), every four months, or at any time as he deems appropriate;

A meeting of the Security Council and the troop-contributing countries is expected to take place in mid-August 2011.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in mid August 2011.

## EUROPE

### **Resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999) – UNMIK**

Resolution 1244 (1999) of 10 June 1999

Para. 20: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council at regular intervals on the implementation of the resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 29 July 2011.

## OTHER

### **Committee established pursuant to resolution 1540 (2004)**

Resolution 1977 (2011) of 20 April 2011

Para. 5(b): requests the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1540 (2004) to consider recommendations for the Committee and the group of experts on expertise requirements, broad geographic representation, working methods, modalities, and structure, including consideration of the feasibility of a coordination and leadership position of the group of experts, and to present these recommendations to the Security Council no later than 31 August 2011.

The 1540 Committee is expected to present its recommendations to the Security Council by 31 August 2011.

**Non-proliferation / DPRK**

Resolution 1718 (2006) of 14 October 2006

Para. 12(g): decides that the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006) shall report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work, with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraph 8 of the resolution.

The Chairman of the 1718 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council during August 2011.

**Security Council Annual Report**

Note by the President of the Security Council of 26 July 2010 (S/2010/507)

Para. 71(a): The draft introduction to the Annual Report of the Security Council to the General Assembly should continue to be prepared under the leadership and responsibility of the President of the Council for the month of July of each calendar year.

The drafting of the introduction to the Annual Report is expected to continue during August 2011.
