**TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE  
SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER 2014**

For information only/not an official document

This tentative forecast of the programme of work of the Security Council has been prepared by the Secretariat for the President of the Council. The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

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**AFRICA**

**Burundi – BNUB**

Resolution 2137 (2014) of 13 February 2014

Para. 20: Requests the Secretary-General to keep the Council informed on the benchmarks, the implementation of the mandate of BNUB and this resolution, and the conditions that affect such implementation, as well as on BNUB's transition to the United Nations Country Team, every 90 days, with a written interim report by the end of July 2014 and a final report by 16 January 2015, and further requests the Secretary-General to report every six months to the Security Council until after the 2015 elections;

The Secretary-General is expected to report to the Security Council in November 2014.

**Central African region – SG report on UNOCA and LRA**

S/PRST/2014/8 of 12 May 2014

Last para: The Security Council requests that the Secretary-General keep it informed on the activities of UNOCA, progress made in conducting assessments of the LRA's evolving area of operations and logistical and support networks, and the efforts being undertaken respectively by missions in the region and other relevant United Nations agencies to implement the UN's Regional Strategy, including through a single report on UNOCA and the LRA to be submitted before 15 November 2014.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be submitted by 15 November 2014.

**Central African Republic – Sanctions: Panel of Experts reports**

Resolution 2127 (2013) of 5 December 2013

Para.59: Requests the Secretary-General to create for an initial period of thirteen months, in consultation with the Committee, and to make the necessary financial and security arrangements to support the work of the Panel, a group of up to five experts ("Panel of Experts"), under the direction of the Committee to carry out the following tasks:  
(c) Provide to the Council, after discussion with the Committee, an update no later than 5 March 2014, an interim report by 5 July 2014 and a final report no later than 5 November 2014;

The final report of the Panel of Experts dated 29 October 2014 (S/2014/762) is before the Security Council.

**Guinea-Bissau – UNIOGBIS**

Resolution 2157 (2014) of 29 May 2014

Para.1: Decides to extend the mandate of UNIOGBIS for a period of 6 months beginning on 1 June 2014 until 30 November 2014:

The mandate of UNIOGBIS will expire on 30 November 2014.

PSC letter of 23 July 2014 (S/2014/529)

Last para.: The members of the Council have taken note of the request contained in your letter that the time frame for the issuance of the report be extended by a period of three months, but they would in turn request that you provide a written update by 12 November 2014, which the Council could consider prior to the expiration of the mandate of the United Nations Integrated Peacebuilding Office in Guinea-Bissau on 30 November 2014.

The written update of the Secretary-General is expected to be provided by 12 November 2014.

**Guinea-Bissau – Implementation of resolution 2048 (2012)**

Resolution 2103 (2013) of 22 May 2013

Para.17: Requests the Secretary-General to submit to the Council regular reports, every 180 days, on the implementation of this resolution and to continue to provide concurrent report on the implementation of resolution 2048 (2012) every 90 days restarting with the adoption of this resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in November 2014.

**Liberia – UNMIL**

Resolution 2176 (2014) of 15 September 2014

Para.4: Requests the Secretary-General to keep it updated on the situation in Liberia by no later than 15 November 2014;

The Secretary-General is expected to report to the Security Council by 15 November 2014.

**Liberia – Sanctions: Assessment mission report**

PSC letter of 16 July 2014 (S/2014/504)

Second para.: As an outcome of the review, the members of the Security Council request the Secretary-General to conduct an assessment mission and report to the Security Council, by 1 October 2014, on the progress that Liberia has made towards meeting the conditions set out in resolution 1521 (2003) for the termination of sanctions, and to provide recommendations on United Nations assistance and other technical assistance to the Government of Liberia in;

The report of the Secretary-General dated 29 September 2014 (S/2014/707) is before the Security Council.

**Libya – ICC Prosecutor**

Resolution 1970 (2011) of 26 February 2011

Para.7: Invites the Prosecutor to address the Security Council within two months of the adoption of this resolution and every six months thereafter on actions taken pursuant to this resolution.

The ICC Prosecutor is expected to brief the Security Council in November 2014.

**Somalia – Authorizations for states and regional organizations in the fight against piracy and armed robbery at sea**

Resolution 2125 (2013) of 18 November 2013

Para 12.: Encourages Member States to continue to cooperate with Somali authorities in the fight against piracy and armed robbery at sea, notes the primary role of Somali authorities in the fight against piracy and armed robbery at sea off the coast of Somalia, and decides that for a further period of twelve months from the date of this resolution to renew the authorizations as set out in paragraph 10 of resolution 1846 (2008) and paragraph 6 of resolution 1851 (2008), as renewed by paragraph 7 of resolution 1897 (2009), paragraph 7 of resolution 1950 (2010), paragraph 9 of resolution 2020 (2011), and paragraph 12 of resolution 2077 (2012) granted to States and regional organizations cooperating with Somali authorities in the fight against piracy and armed robbery at sea off the coast of Somalia, for which advance notification has been provided by Somali authorities to the Secretary-General;

The authorizations will expire on 18 November 2014.

### **Sudan – UNAMID**

#### Resolution 2173 (2014) of 27 August 2014

Para.26: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council every 90 days following adoption of this resolution on UNAMID, including: information on the political, humanitarian and security situation in Darfur, including detailed reporting on incidents of violence and attacks against civilians, by whomsoever perpetrated; information on violations of the Status of Forces Agreement, as well as violations of international humanitarian law perpetrated by any party to the conflict; developments and progress towards achievement of UNAMID's strategic priorities and benchmarks; developments and progress in addressing the challenges facing UNAMID as identified in the review of UNAMID; and on the implementation of this resolution;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in November 2014.

### **Sudan – UNAMID**

#### Resolution 2173 (2014) of 27 August 2014

Para. 5: Welcomes the steps taken so far by UNAMID to implement the review of UNAMID conducted pursuant to resolution 2113 (2014); requests continued swift and full implementation of the review, including the streamlining of all UNAMID's components and aligning of activities to support achievement of its strategic priorities, and the discontinuing of all other tasks not aligned to the Mission's strategic priorities; stresses the importance of the appropriate distribution of tasks and coordination between UNAMID and the UNCT in order to implement the review of UNAMID; and requests a detailed update on the streamlining of the civilian component by 15 September 2014;

The detailed update dated 16 September 2014 (S/2014/670) is before the Security Council.

### **South Sudan – UNMISS**

#### Resolution 2155 (2014) of 27 May 2014

Para.3: Decides to extend the mandate of UNMISS until 30 November 2014, and further decides that UNMISS shall, within the authorized troop ceiling of 12,500 set out in paragraph 8, include a component consisting inter alia of three battalions, with additional responsibility for protecting IGAD's MVM as set out in paragraph 4 (d), as well as implementing the mission's overall mandate as set out in paragraphs 4(a), 4(b) and 4(c) below, consistent with paragraph 5;

The mandate of UNMISS will expire on 30 November 2014.

A meeting between the Security Council and the troop-contributing countries will take place before the expiry of the UNMISS mandate.

### **Sudan – Sanctions: Committee reports**

#### Resolution 1591 (2005) of 29 March 2005

Para.3: Decides, in light of the failure of all parties to the conflict in Darfur to fulfil their commitments;

(a) to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional rules of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council consisting of all the members of the Council (herein “the Committee”), to undertake to following tasks:

iv. to report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work.

The Chair of the 1591 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council in November 2014.

## **ASIA/MIDDLE EAST**

### **Iraq – UNAMI**

#### Resolution 2169 (2014) of 30 July 2014

Para.6: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council every three months on the progress made towards the fulfilment of all UNAMI’s responsibilities.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 31 October 2014 (S/2014/774) is before the Security Council.

### **Iraq/Kuwait – missing persons and return of property**

#### Resolution 2107 (2013) of 27 June 2013

Para. 4: requests that the Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Assistance Mission to Iraq (UNAMI) promote, support and facilitate efforts regarding the repatriation or return of all Kuwaiti and third country nationals or their remains, and the return of Kuwaiti property, including the national archives, seized by Iraq, further requests the Secretary-General to report separately to the Security Council on these matters in his reports on the progress made towards the fulfilment of all UNAMI’s responsibilities...;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in November 2014.

### **The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question**

#### Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para.7: Invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Council informed.

### **International Day of Solidarity with the Palestinian People**

The International Day of Solidarity with the Palestinian People will be commemorated on 24 November 2014.

### **Middle East (Lebanon/UNIFIL) – Implementation of resolution 1701 (2006)**

#### Resolution 2172 (2014) of 26 August 2014

Para.12: Requests the Secretary-General to continue to report to the Council on the implementation of resolution 1701 (2006), every four months, or at any time as he deems appropriate.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in November 2014.

### **Middle East (Syria) – OPCW to report to SC (through SG) on implementation of resolution 2118 (2013)**

#### Resolution 2118 (2013) of 27 September 2013

Para.12: Decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall include relevant information on United Nations activities related to the implementation of this resolution, within 30 days and every month thereafter, and requests further the Director-General of the OPCW and the Secretary-General to report in a coordinated manner, as needed, to the Security Council, non-compliance with this resolution or the OPCW Executive Council decision of 27 September 2013.

The letter of the Secretary-General dated 27 October 2014 (S/2014/767) is before the Security Council.

### **Middle East (Syria) – SG to report to SC on implementation of resolutions 2139 (2014) and 2165 (2014)**

#### Resolution 2139 (2014) of 22 February 2014

Para.17: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution by all parties in Syria, in particular paragraphs 2 through 12, in 30 days of its adoption and every 30 days thereafter, and upon receipt of the Secretary-General's report, expresses its intent to take further steps in the case of non-compliance with this resolution;

#### Resolution 2165 (2014) of 14 July 2014

Para. 10: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution, and on compliance with it by all Syrian parties to the conflict, within the framework of its reporting on resolution 2139 (2014);

The report of the Secretary-General dated 23 October 2014 (S/2014/756) is before the Security Council.

## **EUROPE**

### **Bosnia and Herzegovina – Reports of High Representative to SC thru SG**

#### Resolution 2123 (2013) of 12 November 2013

Para.20: Also requests the Secretary-General to continue to submit to the Council reports from the High Representative, in accordance with annex 10 of the Peace Agreement and the conclusions of the Peace Implementation Conference held in London on 4 and 5 December 1996 (S/1996/1012), and later Peace Implementation Conferences, on the implementation of

the Peace Agreement and in particular on compliance by the parties with their commitments under that Agreement;

The report of the High Representative is expected to be submitted in November 2014.

### **Bosnia and Herzegovina – EUFOR ALTHEA / NATO**

#### Resolution 2123 (2013) of 12 November 2013

Para.10: Authorizes the Member States acting through or in cooperation with the EU to establish for a further period of twelve months, starting from the date of the adoption of this resolution, a multinational stabilization force (EUFOR ALTHEA) as a legal successor to SFOR under unified command and control, which will fulfil its missions in relation to the implementation of annex 1-A and annex 2 of the Peace Agreement in cooperation with the NATO Headquarters presence in accordance with the arrangements agreed between NATO and the EU as communicated to the Security Council in their letters of 19 November 2004, which recognize that EUFOR ALTHEA will have the main peace stabilization role under the military aspects of the Peace Agreement;

The authorization of EUFOR ALTHEA will expire on 12 November 2014.

Para.18: Requests the Member States acting through or in cooperation with the EU and the Member States acting through or in cooperation with NATO to report to the Council on the activity of EUFOR ALTHEA and NATO Headquarters presence respectively, through the appropriate channels and at least at three-monthly intervals.

The letters of the Secretary-General dated 25 September 2014 (S/2014/702) are before the Security Council.

### **Resolutions 1160 (1998), 1199 (1998), 1203 (1998), 1239 (1999) and 1244 (1999) – UNMIK**

#### Resolution 1244 (1999) of 10 June 1999

Para.20: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council at regular intervals on the implementation of this resolution, including reports from the leaderships of the international civil and security presences, the first reports to be submitted within 30 days of the adoption of this resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 31 October 2014 (S/2014/773) is before the Security Council.

## **OTHER**

### **Non-proliferation/DPRK – Sanctions: Committee reports**

#### Resolution 1718 (2006) of 14 October 2006

Para.12: Decides to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional rules of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council consisting of all the members of the Council, to undertake the following tasks:

(g) To report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work, with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraph 8 above.

The Chair of the 1718 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council in November 2014.

### **Non-proliferation/DPRK – Sanctions: Panel of Experts reports**

#### Resolution 2141 (2014) of 5 March 2014

Para. 2: Requests the Panel of Experts to provide to the Committee no later than 5 August 2014 a midterm report on its work, and further requests that, after a discussion with the Committee, the Panel of Experts submit to the Council its midterm report by 5 September 2014, and requests also a final report to the Committee no later than 5 February 2015 with its findings and recommendations, and further requests that, after a discussion with the Committee, the Panel of Experts submit to the Council its final report no later than 5 March 2015;

The interim report of the Panel of Experts dated 3 September 2014 is before the Security Council.

### **Annual Report of the Security Council to the General Assembly**

The President of the Security Council for the month of November is expected to introduce the Security Council Annual Report (A/69/2) in the General Assembly on 13 November 2014, when the Assembly will also take up agenda item 111, Notification by the Secretary-General under Article 12(2) of the Charter of the United Nations, and agenda item 28, Report of the Security Council.

### **Workshop for newly-elected Council members**

The Workshop, sponsored by the Finnish Government, will take place on 13 and 14 November 2014.

### **Peacebuilding – SG reports**

#### S/PRST/2012/29 of 20 December 2012

Last para.: “The Security Council requests the Secretary-General to brief the Council and the General Assembly by December 2013 and submit a report no later than December 2014 on further progress in the United Nations peacebuilding efforts in the aftermath of conflict, including the issue of women’s participation in peacebuilding, and placing particular emphasis on the impact on the ground, including lessons learned from United Nations peacebuilding activities in country specific context, and on progress in taking forward the elements included in this statement, taking into consideration the views of the Peacebuilding Commission.”

The report of the Secretary-General dated 23 September 2014 (S/2014/694) is before the Security Council.

### **Cooperation between UN and regional/subregional organizations – Recommendations on enhancing cooperation between the UN and OIC**

#### Resolution 1809 (2008) of 16 April 2008

Para.17: Requests the Secretary-General to include in his regular reporting to the Security Council, assessments of progress on the cooperation between the United Nations and relevant regional organizations;

#### S/PRST/2013/12 of 6 August 2013



Last para.: The Council further requests that the Secretary-General includes in his next biannual report to the Security Council and the General Assembly on Cooperation between the United Nations and regional and other organizations, recommendations on ways to enhance cooperation between the United Nations and relevant regional and subregional organizations and arrangements.

S/PRST/2013/16 of 28 October 2013

Last para: “The Security Council requests the Secretary-General to include in his next biannual report to the Security Council and the General Assembly on Cooperation between the United Nations and regional and other organizations, recommendations on ways to enhance cooperation between the United Nations and the Organization of Islamic Cooperation.”

The report of the Secretary-General dated 4 August 2014 (S/2014/560) is before the Security Council.

**Work of the UN to help states, sub-regional and regional entities in Africa in fighting terrorism – SG report**

S/PRST/2013/5 of 13 May 2013

Last para: invites the Secretary-General to submit, within 6 months, a concise report providing a comprehensive survey and assessment of the UN’s relevant work to help States, sub-regional and regional entities in Africa in fighting terrorism, with the view to continue consideration of possible steps in this regard.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 9 January 2014 (S/2014/9) is before the Security Council.
