Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General wishes to submit the list of items of which the Security Council is currently seized. The last full list of items (S/2009/10/Add.9) was issued on 9 March 2009. The last weekly addendum (S/2009/10/Add.12) covered developments up to 28 March 2009.

The following list sets out the items of which the Security Council is currently seized and which have been considered by the Council at a formal meeting during the period from 1 January 2006 to 31 March 2009. The list indicates the date on which each item was first taken up by the Council at a formal meeting, and the date of the most recent formal Council meeting held on that item.

The first addendum issued in March 2009 (S/2009/10/Add.9) contained a list of items which were identified in document S/2009/10 as subject to deletion in 2009 because they had not been considered by the Council at a formal meeting during the three-year period from 1 January 2006 to 31 December 2008 and which, pursuant to the procedure set out in the note by the President of the Security Council dated 31 December 2008 (S/2008/847), will remain on the summary statement for one additional year. None of those items (items 59-83) has been considered by the Security Council at a formal meeting since the issuance of S/2009/10/Add.9.

During the week ending 4 April 2009, the Security Council took no action on any of the items of which it is currently seized.
