

## Fact Sheet on the 2653 Haiti Sanctions Committee (2022)

Chair (for the period ending 31 December 2024)	Ambassador Carolyn Rodrigues-Birkett (Guyana)
Mandate	The Committee is mandated to:  • monitor implementation of the sanctions measures with a view to strengthening, facilitating and improving implementation of these measures by Member States, and to consider and decide upon requests for exemptions;  • seek and review information regarding those individuals and entities who may be engaging in the acts described in the listing criteria; designate individuals and entities to be subject to the sanctions measures;  • establish and promulgate such guidelines as may be necessary to facilitate the implementation of the sanctions measures;  • report within 60 days of its establishment to the Security Council on its work with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the sanctions measures and thereafter to report on an annual basis;  • encourage a dialogue between the Committee and interested Member States, in particular those in the region, including by inviting representatives of such States to meet with the Committee to discuss implementation of the sanctions measures;  • seek from all States whatever information it may consider useful regarding the actions taken by them to implement effectively the sanctions measures;  • examine and take appropriate action on information regarding alleged violations or non-compliance with the sanctions measures.
Types of Sanctions	Travel ban, assets freeze, and arms embargo
Monitoring Mechanism/ Panel of Experts	The Panel of Experts established pursuant to resolution 2653 (2022) is comprised of four experts and is home-based. Its mandate was extended by resolution 2752 of 18 October 2024 for a period of 13 months.
