

Fact Sheet on the 1970 Libya Sanctions Committee (2011)

| Mandate | <p>The Committee is mandated to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • monitor implementation of the sanctions measures; • designate those individuals subject to the travel ban and asset freeze measures and to consider requests for exemptions to those measures; • establish such guidelines as may be necessary to facilitate the implementation of the sanctions measures; • report within thirty days to the Security Council on its work for the first report and thereafter to report as deemed necessary by the Committee; • encourage a dialogue between the Committee and interested Member States, in particular those in the region, including by inviting representatives of such States to meet with the Committee to discuss implementation of the measures; • seek from all States whatever information it may consider useful regarding the actions taken by them to implement effectively the sanctions measures; • examine and take appropriate action on information regarding alleged violations or non-compliance with the measures; • designate vessels for some or all of the measures in relation to attempts to illicitly export petroleum, including crude oil and refined petroleum products. |
| Types of Sanctions | Arms embargo, travel ban, assets freeze and business restrictions, and measures in relation to attempts to illicitly export petroleum. |
| Monitoring Mechanism/ Panel of Experts | <p>The Panel of Experts established pursuant to resolution 1973 (2011) is comprised of six experts and is home-based:</p> <p>Salma Arka, regional/transport (Morocco); Georg Kerschischnig, arms/maritime (Austria); Ilyas Oussedik, armed groups (Algeria); Pashupati Nath Pandey, finance (India); Jelena Plamenac, armed groups/international humanitarian law (Serbia); Wenlei Xu, arms (China).</p> <p>The Panel's current mandate was extended by paragraph 17 of Security Council resolution 2701 (2023) until 15 February 2025.</p> <p>The Panel issued its last report on 14 September 2023.</p> |
