Algeria, Colombia, Ethiopia, Malaysia, Nepal, Senegal and Yugoslavia: draft resolution

The Security Council,

Taking note of the statements made regarding the invasion of Panama,

Reaffirming the sovereign and inalienable right of Panama to determine freely its social, economic and political system and to develop its international relations without any form of foreign intervention, interference, subversion, coercion or threat,

Recalling that, in conformity with Article 2, paragraph 4, of the Charter of the United Nations, all Member States are obliged to refrain in their international relations from the threat or use of force against the territorial integrity or political independence of any State, or in any other manner inconsistent with the purposes of the United Nations,

- 1. Strongly deplores the intervention in Panama by the armed forces of the United States of America, which contitutes a flagrant violation of international law and of the independence, sovereignty and territorial integrity of States;
- 2. Demands the immediate cessation of the intervention and the withdrawal of the United States armed forces from Panama;
- 3. <u>Calls upon</u> all States to uphold and respect the sovereignty, independence and territorial integrity of Panama;
- 4. Requests the Secretary-General of the United Nations to monitor the developments in Panama and to report to the Security Council within a twenty-four-hour period after the adoption of the present resolution.
