On behalf of the Government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, I have the honour to express my appreciation for the role played by the International Security Assistance Force (ISAF), authorized under Security Council resolution 1386 (2001) of 20 December 2001 and subsequent resolutions, for the wider contribution that the United Nations is making towards security and stability in Afghanistan.

The International Security Assistance Force, led by NATO since August 2003, has been crucial in improving security initially in Kabul. Its programme of phased expansion in the north, west, south and east of the country, which is very important, has played a key role in this regard.
